Mr. Ned Li was born in China during World War II; had his elementary education in Hong Kong, attended high schools and college (physics major) in Taiwan, ROC; got graduate degrees (astronomy) at U of Western Ontario, Canada and UCLA; and has since settled in east coast Maryland. Ned worked as a **soft engineer** at Singer Link (Silver Spring, MD) for nuclear power plant simulation, a **program analyst/ software developer** at IBM, and retired in 1998. He started in 1974 as a California real estate agent, and has been a Broker since moving to Maryland in 1976. Ned, a “**career volunteer**”, started as a **volunteer** in local Chinese schools. He was a **founder** of CCACC in 1982, and has been serving in CCACC and the community for last 30+ years. He currently serves the **Director** of CCACC Adult Day Healthcare Center which was established in 2008. Ned’s hobby/interest includes sports/basketball, photography, travel, and playing with grandchildren. Ned was voted earlier this year as the most impactful individual for the Chinese community within the Metropolitan DC by the New World Times and the Washington Chinese Post.
